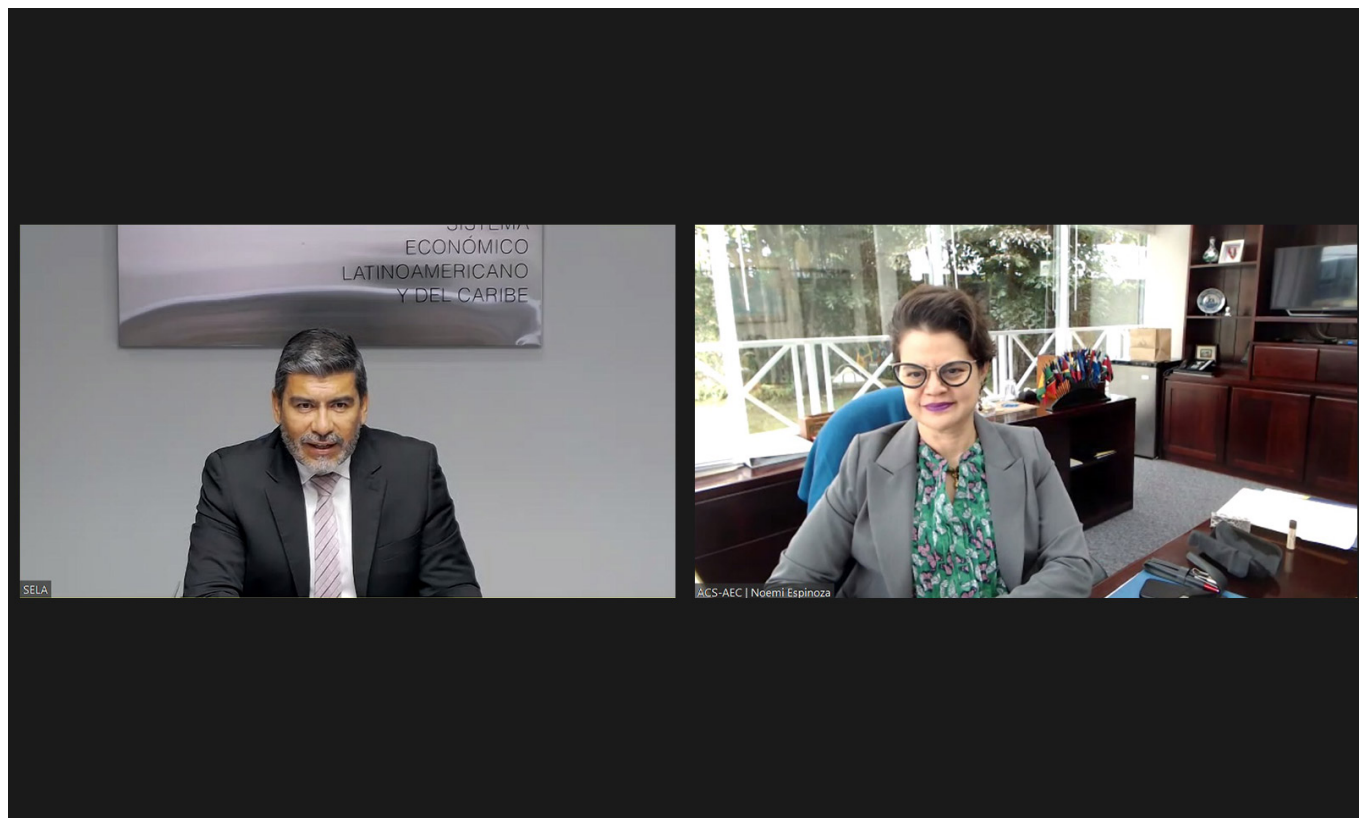


The ACS and SELA Strengthen Ties to Advance Regional Integration and Sustainable Development
